

Cal/EPA: Environmental Justice Listserv

The Cal/EPA EJ Advisory Committee (CEJAC) will meet on June 2 & 3, 2005, in the Coastal Hearing Room of the Cal/EPA Headquarters Building, located at 1001 I Street in Sacramento, California, to discuss, comment, and make recommendations to the Cal/EPA Boards, Departments, and Office (BDOs) on the remaining SWRCB EJ Action Plan pilot projects and the public participation efforts document. This two-day meeting will begin on June 2nd at 1:00 pm, adjourn for the day at 6 pm; and begin on June 3rd at 8:30 am and end at 4:30pm.

The purpose of the meeting is to continue discussions on the remaining EJ Action Plan pilot projects, public participation draft document; and receive an update on the ARB land-use and air quality handbook, cumulative impacts and precautionary approach efforts and modifications made by the BDOs in response to the Committee's comments. The Committee will also be receiving a summary from DTSC on the Midway Village site cleanup and discussing its organizational issues. A detailed agenda will be available 10-days prior to the meeting.
