Introduction and Background

The California Watershed Funding Database is the one-stop site for all environmental funding in the state of California. The site is a web-based, public domain database of watershed funding sources. The database consists of State, Federal and Private Foundation funding information, and allows for queries and contains a variety of linkages to technical and other assistance sites. Similar databases may be available to the public on a pay-per-view service, however this database was developed by CSU, Chico with public domain software to provide free, open use in compliance with the Governor's Grant Information Act of 1999.

Data Entry and Update Capabilities

The database requires little hands-on maintenance. It allows fund program managers to easily update their program information or add new programs. It also allows them to track the number of times users select a funding program from a results list. Attachment 2 shows the screen used for entering new data or updating existing records.

Search capabilities

A keyword search function on the first page allows user to query fund programs at two or three levels of detail. First level categories are:

Agriculture	Natural Resource Planning
Aquatic Ecosystems	Nonpoint Source Management Measures
Coastal Resources	Organizational Capacity
Fisheries and wildlife	Project Implementation
Forestry	Recreation
Grazing	Water and Water Quality
Mining	Water Quantity/Supply

Clicking on each category in the attached linked document will reveal the next query level of key words. The Advanced Search option allows queries by all data fields. Results can be downloaded into an Excel file.

Notification capabilities

The program currently sends a bi-annual email to fund managers providing links for program updates to remind them to update their information. Users can also request email notification of new funding sources that fall within a search.
