■ ERP - \$16.9M






DWQP Grant Moneyby Action Area






Number of Projects by Action Area





Grant Money Awarded by Region






DWQP Grant Money Leveraged to Deliver More Value

Delays in Contracting and Funding -A Significant Road Block

"Don't have the money yet."

"We lost a year of research time waiting for CBDA DWQP to contract with ABAG and DWR."

Lack of Communication Led to Lack of Engagement


